ASSUMPTION'S FIRST FEMALE PRINCIPAL, MS. MARY MARGARET PARENT, RETIRES

Ms. Mary Margaret Parent is ready to graduate! She has chosen 2007 as the year of her retirement from education. Mary Margaret came to Assumption in the fall of 1998 with a wealth of experience, as she was principal at Ursuline College for many years. She then came to Windsor and worked in Adult Education before joining first the staff of Villanova in LaSalle and then Cardinal Carter in Leamington. From there she was appointed Vice-principal here at Assumption, in September 1998 and then Principal in 2003 (acting Principal in 2002). She holds a special place in our history as the first female principal but gender is secondary to the competency and effectiveness she has demonstrated in this important task. She consistently demonstrates that she exemplifies our Christian Love in every aspect of exercising her administrative responsibilities.

Her support for the Assumption Alumni Association has been wonderful. She has always been understanding of our needs and endeavours, always respecting the special relationship of the Alumni as part of the Assumption community. An enthusiastic pursuit of 'what is best for all' is never an easy way to get things done, but Mary Margaret has always taken



the time and extra effort to do just that – using her wisdom and experience to help all concerned to see the best solution to any situation. She has always been a friend and supporter, appreciating the worth of our efforts. Her leadership has demonstrated strong advocacy of our Christian faith.

There's an angel among us; She's like a gentle breeze, a whisper barely touching the ground as she flits and flees, sprinkling each of us with love. Can you see her? There she is. There she goes. She leaves no footprints, only heart prints.

I asked a few, "Do you know her?" They said no – but we know of her. "What do you know?", I asked.

She is kind, whimsical, playful, a caring leader, pensive, powerful, honest and moral. A listener, a teacher, a mother, a sister and friend.

Do you feel it – that gentle breeze?

There's an angel among us.

SIX DEGREES OF SEPARATION BASILIANS, ASSUMPTION COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL AND THE FAMILY OF MARY MARGARET PARENT

Since our big sister has made that life altering decision to retire from the Teaching profession, I thought it was a great time to reflect on her life and the very hidden connection she has had all along with the Basilians and Assumption College High School. It all goes back to Fr. Charles



Armstrong. Yes, the man who is famous at this institution for his love of all things athletic.

Fr. Charles Armstrong has a sister named Rose. Rose met and married a gentleman by the name of Phil Belleheumer. They had a very good friend by the name of Lawrence Parent. Now in the late 1940s after the war had ended, Lawrence, still being single, was introduced on a blind date to Elizabeth Florence Troy. Now Lawrence knew the Armstrongs through his good friend, Phil, but Lawrence also attended Assumption College High School where he completed the technical course offered here in the 1920s and 1930s.

Now Lawrence and Florence (the name that she went by) fell in love and married. Fourteen months later the first of their seven children was born - Mary Margaret Parent. Now this eldest daughter grew and showed a great aptitude for music. She was also an excellent student. She graduated from Corpus Christi and then F.J. Brennan High School as an Ontario Scholar and from there went on to attend Brescia College at the University of Western Ontario obtaining a degree in History and Latin. She then began a very successful career in the teaching profession. She taught grade school for only one year and then went to the Ursuline College, The Pines in Chatham, Ontario to teach and then to the position of Principal. After many years there she moved back to Windsor where she taught and was an administrator with the Public School Board in the Adult Education Program. She then eventually arrived at the Windsor Essex County Separate School Board, first back in the classroom at Villanova and then Cardinal Carter. Her administrative talents were noted and she was eventually assigned as a Vice Principal at Assumption College High School. A few years later the position of Principal became open at this illustrious institution and the Board in their wisdom recognized the abilities this woman possessed and took the bold step of appointing the first ever female principal to this school with a history of being for many years, an all male institution. Even when it became a co-educational institution in the 1970s, the tradition of a male at the helm remained until Mary Margaret's appointment.

Now one may think the story ends there, but not so. As fate would have it, Mary Margaret has a nephew who in September 2003 decided to attend Assumption College High School. For the next four years they both walked these hallowed halls, quietly acknowledging one another but never drawing attention to the fact that they were not only a part of the Assumption Family but were family away from school as well. This young man flourished in this institution run by his aunt and excelled beyond his wildest dreams. Now as Mary Margaret decides to move on to the next stage of her life, so too does her nephew Brendan Parent. And with these two individuals embarking on the next great adventures in their lives, the Parent family attachment to Assumption College High School comes full circle.

We have seen the connection from the Basilians through Fr. Charles Armstrong to his sister Rose and her husband Phil to Lawrence Parent to Florence Troy to their first-born Mary Margaret Parent to her nephew Brendan Parent. So as you can see, that theory of six degrees of separation does hold true. The Parent Family has been fortunate and blessed by its association with the Basilians and Assumption College High School, but I suggest that Assumption has also been blessed by the members of the Parent family as well. Mary Margaret and Brendan, as you both prepare to say your goodbyes, may your memories also bring a smile to your faces and warmth to your hearts. DR. LEONARDO CORTESE, '74

Leader in Local Schizophrenia Challenge

Known to most of his high school peers as 'Nardo", Dr. Len Cortese has been called upon from around the world to lecture on his research in the areas of Schizophrenia,



Antipsychotic Medication and Movement Disorders. However, he once again calls Windsor home. Dr. Cortese has recently returned to Windsor with his wife Mary Lou, (whom he met and married in London, Ontario in 1990) and their 6 year old son Luca.

Len came to Windsor as Clinical Director of Specialized Mental Health Services at Windsor Regional Hospital, Western Campus. He continues to be an Associate Professor at the University of Western Ontario in the Faculty of Medicine and in the Department of Psychiatry from which he has received numerous teaching-excellence awards. He also has cross-appointments in the Departments of Neurology, Pharmacology, Toxicology and Family Medicine. Len also continues as an associate clinical scientist with the Lawson Research Institute and a consultant psychiatrist with the Neuropsychiatry Division at Western.

In the short few years since his arrival in Windsor, he has established and raised independent multiyear funding for the Schizophrenia and Early Episode Psychosis Program, in addition to his work as the lead in developing clinical services for the specialized mental health programs at Windsor Regional Hospital. In addition, he has served as Psychiatry lead for the new satellite medical school, which has provided psychiatry rotation for many undergraduate medical students and soon to provide resident teaching.

Congratulations to Fr. Mike Dalton who recently celebrated two very important anniversaries; his 105th birthday on May 5, 2007 and his 75th anniversary of

priestly ordination on May 21, 2007. A special mass was celebrated that Saturday morning in Courtland, Ontario (east of Tillsonburg) and an aircraft fly-by was performed courtesy of the local Harvard aircraft club. Fr. Dalton, a Second World War Veteran, served as a Roman Catholic military chaplain with the Fourth Canadian Infantry Brigade.

Fr. Dalton's first 105 years

Graduated from Assumption in 1926 and then from Assumption College (like University) in 1928.

He was ordained in 1932.

He served the congregation of Holy Names and St. Alphonsus until 1939.

He then became chaplain of the Canadian Forces Overseas. On his return he wrote a book "His Personal War Diary", a warm, poignant, sometimes humorous, yet dramatic view of the war.


Then he was pastor at Most Precious Blood, Windsor; St. John's, Woodslee; St. John Brebeuf, Kingsville.

In 1970, officially retired, he lived as chaplain at Sacred Heart Villa, Courtland, which has been his

Villa, Courtland, which has been his home since (now known as Caressant Care Nursing Home). He continues to stay as active as possible by reading and writing. Sherrilynn Colley-Vegh has been appointed principal at Assumption for September 2007.

She has taught many years in the elementary and secondary panel and was department head of Guidance and

vice-principal in 3 elementary and secondary schools. Her last appointment was vice-Principal at St. Michael's Alternate Catholic High School on Victoria St. in Windsor.

She has earned 2 degrees in Windsor, a B.Ed. at Western, a Masters at Wayne State and her principals qualifications in Windsor and Supervisory Officer at Western.

Sherrilynn has played and coached many sports. Throughout high school she played on both school and travel teams in 12 sports and received scholarships in two sports - basketball and hockey. Her Assumption connection takes her back to grade 6, 7 and 8 when she was the goal tender while attending Immaculate Conception. She has fond memories of the boys vs. girls games and Fr. Cullen throwing a water bottle her way because the boys weren't scoring on her.

In her spare time, she enjoys traveling (to over 50 countries and none free even though her husband Ken is a pilot). She volunteers for many community organizations and owns a women's clothing store called, BCG Diva. Sherrilynn truly lives the Gospel - her volunteer experience and contributions not only to our community but also to the world are incredible. She is pretty modest but we have no problem bragging. Here are a few.

Community organizational involvements include Windsor-Essex Leadership (first graduating class) Erie Street Business Association and Join the Battle (prostate cancer fundraiser). She has most recently been involved with many fundraising activities and events for several community not-for-profit organizations.

Sherrilynn is married to Ken Vegh and has a 10 year old son Christian. She is looking forward to the proud traditions of Assumption since her father, Ron Colley, '49-'50, was an alumnus. ASSUMPTION COLLEGE SCHOOL: (early impressions/ adjustments, memorable moments/ students, etc.)

One of my first impressions was that the classrooms were so drab and bare - a definitely male environment. At SMA, the teachers decorated their rooms with plants that gave a feminine touch as did the lovely bulletin boards and inspirational sayings on the boards. The corridors "crowded" at the change of classes were so Assumption.

The overwhelming importance of sports. At SMA, sports were just one of the many important activities; drama,

united nations club, music, etc.

I was "shocked" at the first graduation as both boys and "our ladylike girls" walked on stage in any order, talking, waving, chewing gum, etc. The following year one of the SMA teachers volunteered to be on the committee organizing graduation and things greatly improved.

I was impressed by the openness and good will of both administration and staff. I loved my 12 years at

Assumption.





1956-1957

High school enrollment for the year was 930 students, with some 154 in the boarder's residence. Tuition for Grades 9 & 10 was \$125, while Senior Division students paid \$135. Tuition and board for residence students was \$800, with the price rising by \$100 if the student desired a semi private room.

The writer for the Reporter waxed eloquent on the new building: "This fall, on Monday, September 21, for the first time in almost 100 years, Assumption High School held its classes away from the College buildings. On that day, the entire student body moved to the new, \$2,000,000 school on Huron Line. This building, two years in the building, has a capacity of approximately 930 students.... The school was built in two sections, the first section, the 'old wing', stretches along Huron Line. This houses the stage, the cafeteria, the lobby, the offices, the library and one story of classrooms. In the basement are the locker room, sports shop, future candy pond, and various unfinished rooms. The 'new' wing, which is perpendicular to Huron Line, contains the gym, two stories of classrooms, the band room, and assorted teachers' offices and storerooms. In the basement, there are the 'jug-room', and many uncompleted rooms. The new classrooms are large and airy, with almost one whole side composed of windows. The lowest panes of the window are frosted to hinder the students' daydreaming. The halls are quite roomy but the stairways are 'a little less so. One of the outstanding features is the raised level Physics classroom, with separate gas and electricity outlets for each pair of students. Another startling feature is the variety of 'colours'? with which the classrooms are painted. Most of these colours the rainbow never heard of. These are intended to startle the students so that they aren't able to fall asleep. The desks are constructed of a light, smooth material, and are each separate from the rest.... This is a great place but still it is only a part of the whole school planned for the future. This will probably include two more school wings, a priests' residence, a recreation hall with a swimming pool etc., and a boarder residence with all the accessories.... This is a wonderful school, and we should make the most of it while we're still around to enjoy it."

One Assumption sports' team (football) met with athletic success during the year. In the autumn, the Purple Raiders defeated Walkerville 23-1 to win the W.S.S.A. title for the second consecutive year. Then they moved on to London where they defeated the Beck Spartans 31-6 to take the W.O.S.S.A. crown.

Activities of the year included the Dramatic Club presentations of "Heaven Can Wait" and "Room Service"; the work of the Sodality, Y.C.S., and Legion of Mary, the St. John Bosco Club, the Mission Society, the Band, and the Father-Son Banquet. Once again, Assumption came away with top honours in the W.S.S.A. Oratorical Contest as James Dorko was crowned Senior Champ, and Joe Doumani followed up as Junior Champ. It was the first time in Assumption's history that the school had captured both divisions. Unfortunately, there was no yearbook this year. The \$5000 cost was too steep for a production to be made, and instead, the Seniors were given bound copies of the year's Reporter.

1981-1982

Student population for the year reached 1,840 students. Senior level tuition was \$620 with another \$20 in incidental fees. For the 140 boarders in residence, room and board was \$3500.

The year opened with Father Frank McCabe again at the helm of the school. Some 110 staff members were there to lead and direct the students for another year. Some 366 grads took their places in Assumption's annals and departed in June to find their dreams.... In sports, the Cross Country and Track and Field teams dominated the scene with their successes. In Cross Country, the Junior Girls, Midget Boys and Junior Boys all were S.W.O.S.S.A. Champs. Special mention should be made of the work of Donna Thibert and Annette Pelletier, both of whom were silver medalists at O.F.S.A.A., marking the first time in history that Windsor area medalists had done so well there. In Track & Field, the Midget Girls, Midget Boys and Junior Boys all duplicated this effort, while the Junior Girls won O.F.S.A.A....The hockey team also won the W.S.S.A. crown, and ended up fourth in the province. The Freshman Basketball squad met with a similar success in the city playoffs. Athletes of the Year Awards went to Rob Sartor and Denise Hebert. Ritchie Coughlin (for the second straight year) and Diane Deluca were named Student Athletes of the Year.

Around the school, The Crusader yearbook was published again, with the help of the Photography Club. As well, there was Reach for the Top, Student Council and its special days: Talent Show and Mike Mandell. Ron Stephens' dramatists successfully staged "My Fair Lady". Rock climbing became a popular extracurricular activity because of the skill and enthusiasm of Father Bob Holmes. There were the usual multitude of activities from the Blood Drive to the Can Drive to C.A.C.H. Radio, the Senior Band, Stage Band, Pep Band, the Assumption Singers and the Intermediate Band. Special acclaim came to Assumption when their musicians performed at Cleary Auditorium. Once again, the Mothers' Club, with its Fashion Show and Spring Fair, and the Dads' Club did yeoman service in raising funds for the school. As well, there was the Italian Club, Chess Club, Blood Drive, Rock Climbing, Student Travel to Quebec and Europe, Math Contestants, Missions, the school paper, the Grapevine, Bowling, and the Grade Nine Track Meet to round off the activities.




